# THE CROWN ROYALS M.C. KIRKWOOD, MO

I took off in the wee hours of a Friday morning from Houston, Texas to attend the Crown Royals M.C.'s Annual Fish Fry, Dance and Party the weekend of September 29-31, 1995. At 7:00pm Missouri time, I stopped, called for directions and a Crown Royal member came to pick me up, which happened to be Gus Parker. We didn't have far to go, the clubhouse is about five blocks from the main drag of Lindburg Avenue and I-44 East on 324 Memphis Street.

At the entry gate to the clubhouse, I met President Frank Reed, who introduced me to a few of their many members and

THE CLUBHOUSE: The clubhouse property takes up one side of Memphis Street with a large grassy lawn on the right side of it, a patio in the back connected to a three-car garage, and designated automobile and motorcycle parking on the left and front side of the building. The designated motorcycle parking is strictly enforced from April-October. The lawn and patio has lots of picnic benches and tables, placed under huge shade-trees. The whole conglomeration is enclosed in a chain-linked fence. Across the street is land, which they also use for automobile parking. Imagination and hard work is how the clubhouse came to be. Photos on the wall of the dance floor were of a severely dilapidated, burned out and condemned 3-story apartment building. full inside and out, of trash, junked cars and debris from storms and rain. In spite of the mess, members of the club was able to see a foundation with which to build their status in the community. After negotiating the purchase of the building in 1988, member expertise was employed to make rebuilding and remodeling as cheap as possible, only two jobs had to be hired out: plumbing and having the building re-wired. The project was finished by 1989 — approximately 9

months later. The first floor has a full bar and kitchen, restroom, dance floor, front, side and back doors. On one side of the second floor is the game room with dart board and pool table, TV and card table, with a back door leading to an outside stairway. The other side is the executive office — complete with showers, lockers and member lounge. The third floor is a small area used for storage for the time being.

THE MEMBERS: The Crown Royals M.C. was founded in 1975 and consists of 38-40 members. The first President, John Ewing (Boss Hog) ended his term in 1993, and Frank


are stricter than the


